











These are photos of a Stroke survivors floor in Kent.

The Power of Social Media: At the end of May 2018, we were contacted on social media by a resident of a housing association property, who is a disabled stroke survivor, he wanted to know if we could help, basically he fell through his laminate flooring because the floor joists gave way due to rot, because in the infamous wisdom of the housing association they had arranged fo a new path outside but they omitted to install air bricks and a Manchester drain. Luckily the stroke survivor wasn't injured or hurt in this incident but his pride and property have been severely damaged. So we got involved and highlighted that the housing association haven't helped with the anxiety levels of their tenant but have also failed to repair the floor in 10 weeks, we got involved and the floor was made safe temporarily within 8 hours. Now they have fixed the joists but will not replace the laminate flooring as this is classed as decoration, however the floor wouldn't have been damaged if correct construction procedure had been followed on the laying of the path outside. Now we have initiated discussions with the housing association and thus far, they have offered £250 in compensation and they have stated that the tenant is more than entitled to spend the £250 on new laminate flooring.
